On January 21st 2010 at 16:55hrs a complaint of a disturbance was received from Lloyd Andrew GILBERT. GILBERT advised that he had been assaulted

17:40hrs

Cst. BUTLER and Cst. COURTORIELLE attended GILBERTS residence located at 2665 Shuswap crescent to obtain further details. GILBERT exited his residence to speak with members. Cst. BUTLER spoke with GILBERT, and attempted to obtain further information about the assault. GILBERT was highly intoxicated, had a strong odour of liquor on his breath and was wobbling back and forth. Cst. BUTLER began to question GILBERT about the assault. GILBERT became very angry, began screaming and yelling, and became belligerent with Cst. BUTLER. GILBERT would not calm down, provide any details of the assault, and continued screaming and yelling, and was pointing his finger in Cst. BUTLER's face. Cst. BUTLER arrested GILBERT for causing a disturbance. GILBERT was chartered and warned by Cst. BUTLER, handcuffed and placed in the back of the police vehicle.

17:50hrs

Cst. BUTLER spoke with

-That GILBERTS front door was suddenly smashed in.

Cst. BUTLER advised :

Cst. BUTLER observed the two(2) bottom hinges and Jam of the front door had been freshly busted off, and the interior trim of the side kitchen door was laying across the kitchen table. The interior of the residence did not show any signs of a struggle, and all the furniture appeared to be in place, but was littered with empty beer cans. Cst. BUTLER and Cst. COURTOREILLE departed the residence and transported GILBERT to police cells.

GILBERT was placed in cells. No physical signs of assault could be observed on GILBERT's face or body.

Cst. BUTLER spoke with Cst. Matt SHEARER who advised he would attempt a statement from GILBERT later in the evening when he was sober.

The victim/complainant GILBERT would not provide details, and had to be arrested while trying to investigate the complaint.

On Thursday January 21, 2010 Cst. SHEARER assisted Cst. BUTLER in attempting to obtain a statement from Lloyd GILBERT regarding a break and enter that occurred at his residence earlier on this date. GILBERT had been arrested after becoming very angry, screaming, yelling, and belligerent with Cst. BUTLER. GILBERT would not calm down, provide any details of the incident and continued screaming and yelling. GILBERT was currently in Williams Lake Detachment cells and Cst. SHEARER would attempt a statement when GILBERT sobers up.

At 00:47 hours on Friday January 22, 2010 Cst. SHEARER attended the Williams Lake cell block. Cst. SHEARER spoke with GILBERT in his cells and upon ascertaining that GILBERT was competent enough to provide a clear statement asked him to accompany Cst. SHEARER to the cell block interview room. GILBERT complied and while going through basic personal history with him, GILBERT became very upset and described a number of past grievances with police. Cst. SHEARER explained that at this time he would like to find out what happened tonight in order for the investigation to move forward. GILBERT provided only a brief detail of the incident stating:

he called 911 for help and was arrested by the police that arrived. GILBERT stated a number of times that he wanted While speaking with GILBERT he could only recall

GILBERT was asked to provide an audio recorded statement for this purpose; however, he declined and stated that he was simply too exhausted. Cst. SHEARER asked if GILBERT would be available to speak with a Member in the morning, GILBERT said that he would be recording everything that happened in detail. Cst. SHEARER advised that shortly someone would be releasing him from cells as he was evidently no longer intoxicated to the point of causing a disturbance or harming himself or others.

Cst. SHEARER will be passing this file to Detachment Management for follow up on Friday January 22, 2010.

On Friday January 22, 2010 at 16:57 hours Cst. SHEARER contacted GILBERT at his residence. GILBERT advised that Cst. SMITH visited him today and that he obtained photos of him and his residence. GILBERT said that he very much wishes to follow through with charges in this matter; however, he feels too tired and exhausted to do so today. GILBERT would like police to contact him on Monday for the statement. GILBERT stated that he was not afraid of

Constable SMITH took photos of the rear side door and doorway to the residence. The door looked as if it was forced open. There was a couple of pieces of the doorway lying on the floor of the residence. GILBERT was not willing to provide a statement with respect to this investigation at this time. GILBERT requested that Constable BUTLER attend his residence later this evening for a statement.

- GILBERT went into his room to go to bed.

- approximately 5-10 minutes GILBERT came out of his residence on was on the phone.

Constable SMITH placed the photos on the hard copy file. Constable SMITH forwarded and Constable SMITH's Police Notes to Constable BUTLER. Constable SMITH did not have any further involvement with this investigation.

I, Constable S.J. COURTOREILLE, am a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, engaged as a general duty constable at the Williams Lake detachment since August 2007. On this day, Cst. COURTOREILLE was wearing a Royal Canadian Mounted Police issued uniform and driving a marked police vehicle.

On January 21st, 2010 at approximately 16:55, Gilbert LLYOD reported that attacked him and threatened him

Dispatch advised that LLYOD was heavily intoxicated, hard to understand and it was hard for Dispatch to understand him. LLYOD

LLYOD never seen a bat. LLYOD called back and stated that he had been waiting for half a hour, people are trying to kill him and was yelling for help.

At approximately 17:26, Cst. COURTOREILLE and Cst. BULTER were dispatched to the complaint, responded and arrived at 2665 Shuswap Crescent at 17:39. Cst. BULTER knocked on the door of the residence, a few seconds later GILBERT exited the residence and stood on the residence's porch. Cst. BULTER asked GILBERT what happened and GILBERT stated that he was beat up. GILBERT's speech was slurred and he reeked of liquor. GILBERT swayed back and forth while standing on the porch and several times almost fell into the Cst. BULTER. Cst. BULTER had to step back so GILBERT would not fall into him. It was clear to Cst. COURTOREILLE that GILBERT was heavily intoxicated.

GILBERT attitude was angry and he would not listen to Cst. BULTER's questions. GILBERT began yelling and screaming at Cst. BULTER stating that repeated several times "I was assault". Cst. BULTER attempted to calm GILBERT down and stated that we are here to help you. GILBERT still continued to yell and scream at Cst. BULTER and at one pointed his finger in Cst. BULTER face.

Cst. COURTOREILLE noted that

GILBERT by the left arm and advised he was under arrest for causing a disturbance. GILBERT attempted to pull away from Cst. BULTER and was still yelling and screaming. Cst. COURTOREILLE grabbed GILBERT's other arm and assisted Cst. BULTER in putting GILBERT into handcuffs. GILBERT continued to struggle while being put into handcuff and while being escorted into the police vehicle.

GILBERT continued to yell and scream while in the back seat of the police vehicle.

table and the house was a mess. Cst. COURTOREILLE observed that the side door was damaged. The door trim was laying on the floor, and the dead bolt to the door was exposed. This suggested that the door was forced open at some point while the dead bolt was engaged in the lock position.

Cst. COURTOREILLE went back to his police vehicle, where GILBERT was still yelling and screaming that "he was assaulted, that the police were not doing anything and that police hate native people". Cst. COURTOREILLE did not speak to GILBERT as he was already extremely upset, angry and initial would not listen to what police had to ask him.

GILBERT was transported to cells where he was escorted in to cells, search and placed into a cell. Approximately 10 minutes later, the Williams Lake RCMP guard Jeremy BOSTON asked a member to come down stairs because GILBERT was standing on the sink in the cell and was trying to take the screws off a vent.

Cst. COURTOREILLE and Cst. PENTON entered GILBERT's cell and asked him to get off the sink. GILBERT was uncooperative and said "get me the fuck out of here". GILBERT after a few moments got down from the sink and sat down on the cement bench in his cell. Cst. COURTOREILLE told GILBERT to not stand on the sink since he could fall and hurt himself. GILBERT was still heavily intoxicated and Cst. COURTOREILLE was concerned that GILBERT might seriously hurt himself if he climbed up on the sink again.

Cst. COURTOREILLE entered the guard room and BOSTON advised that GILBERT was standing back on the sink again. Cst. COURTOREILLE and Cst. PENTON re entered GILBERT's cell block and told GILBERT to get off the sink. GILBERT was attempting to unscrew the screws on the roof vent in an attempt to escape from cells. This task would be difficult for GILBERT to be successful in. GILBERT was placed into another cell phone where he could be closely monitored.

Cst. COURTOREILLE escorted GILBERT into another cell also known as the drunk tank. As soon as Cst. COURTOREILLE closed the door, GILBERT stood on top of the sink and would not get off. The sink is approximately 4 feet height and a fall from the height could cause serious injury. Cpl. BUKKOS was advised of the cell block situation and Cpl. BUKKOS talked GILBERT down from the sink. GILBERT was confrontational and was aggressive towards Cpl. BUKKOS. Cst. COURTOREILLE stood in the door way of the cell to ensure GILBERT did not assault Cpl. BUKKOS.

Cst. COURTOREILLE left the cell block and was later called back to cells since GILBERT was fighting with members. GILBERT had been placed in restraint chair prior to Cst. COURTOREILLE entering the cell block.

Cst. COURTOREILLE did not have any further involvement in this matter.
