Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (the Act)

I am writing in response to your request received by the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General for the following records:

Correspondence related to the termination of former Chief Coroner Dr. Diane Rothon from October 20, 2010 until January 6, 2011.

Please find enclosed copies of the requested records. Some of the records contain information which is excepted from disclosure under the Act. Wherever this occurs, we have noted the section of the Act that applies. In the case of the enclosed records, we have severed information under section 13 (policy advice or recommendations) and section 14 (legal advice), and section 22 (harm to personal privacy). Copies of these sections are enclosed for your reference. Your file with our office is now closed.

Where section 22 is noted, this means that we have removed the personal information of a third party, usually a name or other private information about another individual. The Act requires us to remove third party personal information.

You have a right to request a review of this decision. You have 30 business days to request a review. I have enclosed information regarding this process. Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act

[RSBC 1996] Chapter 165

Policy advice, recommendations or draft regulations

- 13 (1) The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information that would reveal advice or recommendations developed by or for a public body or a minister.
 - (2) The head of a public body must not refuse to disclose under subsection (1)
 - (a) any factual material,
 - (b) a public opinion poll,
 - (c) a statistical survey,
 - (d) an appraisal,
 - (e) an economic forecast,
 - (f) an environmental impact statement or similar information.
 - (g) a final report or final audit on the performance or efficiency of a public body or on any of its programs or policies,
 - (h) a consumer test report or a report of a test carried out on a product to test equipment of the public body,
 - (i) a feasibility or technical study, including a cost estimate, relating to a policy or project of the public body,
 - (j) a report on the results of field research undertaken before a policy proposal is formulated.
 - (k) a report of a task force, committee, council or similar body that has been established to consider any matter and make reports or recommendations to a public body,
 - (l) a plan or proposal to establish a new program or to change a program, if the plan or proposal has been approved or rejected by the head of the public body,
 - (m) information that the head of the public body has cited publicly as the basis for making a decision or formulating a policy, or
 - (n) a decision, including reasons, that is made in the exercise of a discretionary power or an adjudicative function and that affects the rights of the applicant.
 - (3) Subsection (1) does not apply to information in a record that has been in existence for 10 or more years.

14. The head of a public body may refuse to disclose to an applicant information that is subject to solicitor client privilege.

Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act

[RSBC 1996] Chapter 165

Disclosure harmful to personal privacy

- 22 (1) The head of a public body must refuse to disclose personal information to an applicant if the disclosure would be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy.
 - (2) In determining under subsection (1) or (3) whether a disclosure of personal information constitutes an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy, the head of a public body must consider all the relevant circumstances, including whether
 - (a) the disclosure is desirable for the purpose of subjecting the activities of the government of British Columbia or a public body to public scrutiny,
 - (b) the disclosure is likely to promote public health and safety or to promote the protection of the environment,
 - (c) the personal information is relevant to a fair determination of the applicant's rights,
 - (d) the disclosure will assist in researching or validating the claims, disputes or grievances of aboriginal people,
 - (e) the third party will be exposed unfairly to financial or other harm,
 - (f) the personal information has been supplied in confidence,
 - (g) the personal information is likely to be inaccurate or unreliable, and
 - (h) the disclosure may unfairly damage the reputation of any person referred to in the record requested by the applicant.
 - (3) A disclosure of personal information is presumed to be an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if
 - (a) the personal information relates to a medical, psychiatric or psychological history, diagnosis, condition, treatment or evaluation,
 - (b) the personal information was compiled and is identifiable as part of an investigation into a possible violation of law, except to the extent that disclosure is necessary to prosecute the violation or to continue the investigation,
 - (c) the personal information relates to eligibility for income assistance or social service benefits or to the determination of benefit levels.
 - (d) the personal information relates to employment, occupational or educational history,
 - (e) the personal information was obtained on a tax return or gathered for the purpose of collecting a tax,
 - (f) the personal information describes the third party's finances, income, assets, liabilities, net worth, bank balances, financial history or activities, or creditworthiness,
 - (g) the personal information consists of personal recommendations or evaluations, character references or personnel evaluations about the third party.

- (h) the disclosure could reasonably be expected to reveal that the third party supplied, in confidence, a personal recommendation or evaluation, character reference or personnel evaluation,
- (i) the personal information indicates the third party's racial or ethnic origin, sexual orientation or religious or political beliefs or associations, or
- (j) the personal information consists of the third party's name, address or telephone number and is to be used for mailing lists or solicitations by telephone or other means.
- (4) A disclosure of personal information is not an unreasonable invasion of a third party's personal privacy if
 - (a) the third party has, in writing, consented to or requested the disclosure,
 - (b) there are compelling circumstances affecting anyone's health or safety and notice of disclosure is mailed to the last known address of the third party,
 - (c) an enactment of British Columbia or Canada authorizes the disclosure,
 - (d) the disclosure is for a research or statistical purpose and is in accordance with section 35,
 - (e) the information is about the third party's position, functions or remuneration as an officer, employee or member of a public body or as a member of a minister's staff,
 - (f) the disclosure reveals financial and other details of a contract to supply goods or services to a public body,
 - (g) public access to the information is provided under the Financial Information Act,
 - (h) the information is about expenses incurred by the third party while travelling at the expense of a public body,
 - (i) the disclosure reveals details of a licence, permit or other similar discretionary benefit granted to the third party by a public body, not including personal information supplied in support of the application for the benefit, or
 - (j) the disclosure reveals details of a discretionary benefit of a financial nature granted to the third party by a public body, not including personal information that is supplied in support of the application for the benefit or is referred to in subsection (3) (c).
- (5) On refusing, under this section, to disclose personal information supplied in confidence about an applicant, the head of the public body must give the applicant a summary of the information unless the summary cannot be prepared without disclosing the identity of a third party who supplied the personal information.
- (6) The head of the public body may allow the third party to prepare the summary of personal information under subsection (5).

B.C.'s new chief coroner is no longer on the job just eight months after she was appointed, but is not yet clear why she was "terminated" by the government.

Dr. Diane Rothon was appointed on April 1, making her the first medical doctor to take the post in 30 years. Previous chief coroners have been retired police officers.

A statement released by Ministry of Public Safety confirmed Rothon "left the employ of the B.C. government on" Monday, but the government would not be commenting further on her "termination."

"The termination of an employee is a personal issue that will not be discussed publicly," said the statement.

Rothon refused to comment on her dismissal when contacted by CBC News, but has said she didn't see eye to eye with her employer. [pssg]

(Summary: Dr. Rothon's resignation has sparked calls for an independent coroners service from NDP critic Mike Farnworth, B.C.'s Representative for Children and Youth, Mary Ellen Turpel-Lafond and former chief coroner Terry Smith.)

The sudden resignation of B.C.'s chief coroner over concerns that government has eroded the integrity of the office has renewed calls for an independent coroners service free from political interference.

Dr Diane Rothon said she resigned as chief coroner Monday over a disagreement with the government about the future direction of her organization, which is supposed to act as an independent investigator of unexplained and unexpected deaths in B.C.

Rothon would not outline her specific concerns, except to say she did not see eye-to-eye with government. She had been in the job only nine months. The Solicitor General's Ministry said she was fired, but would not say why.

Former chief coroners and B.C.'s independent children's watchdog expressed concern Thursday about how government has encroached on the office's independence, including forcing it to submit its reports -- which contain recommendations to prevent future deaths that can be critical of government policies -- to the government public affairs bureau for review.

"I think in order to have an effective coroners service, it needs to have a much higher level of independence than what it currently has," said Terry Smith, the chief coroner from 2001-2009. "I believe we ought to be thinking about making it an independent officer of the legislature, and I think to do otherwise probably places some systemic inflexibilities that detract from the effectiveness of the position."

Although the coroners service is considered "judicially independent" from government, with its own law to gather evidence and force testimony under oath, it is also part of the Solicitor General's Ministry, where it reports to bureaucrats and receives a set budget by the minister.

The legislature's independent officers, such as the privacy commissioner, police complaints commissioner and auditor general, receive their public funding from an all-party finance committee and do not take orders from bureaucrats or politicians.

"There are times when a chief coroner, and the coroners service generally, needs to speak out as an independent entity and to address the facts as they are seen from an independent perspective, and there shouldn't be the pressure of having to temper comments that may offend political sensibilities," Smith said.

Senator Larry Campbell, a former chief coroner, also raised concerns about the government's public affairs people seeing reports before the public. "I'd never have allowed that," he said.

Campbell, who was chief coroner from 1996 to 2000 and the inspiration for the TV show Da Vinci's Inquest, said a coroner's first responsibility is to the person who has died, and then to the families and the public. The government should be given the report at the same time as everybody else, he said. "I just don't think reports should be vetted," Campbell said.

Campbell said he never experienced any political interference during his time as a coroner. But he acknowledged there was always friction, often over budget issues.

A respected person from outside government should be brought in to review what has gone wrong inside the coroners service, said B.C.'s Representative for Children and Youth, Mary Ellen Turpel-Lafond, who frequently works with the office on child death cases.

She said the coroner's lack of independence is compounded by budget constraints that have led to "significant delays" in autopsy results, toxicology reports and judgments of inquiry on causes of death.

"This is one of the most ancient bodies of government, the coroners service, and I think the instability is a concern," she said.

Both Smith and Turpel-Lafond said controversy over Rothon's departure and the state of the organization will make it difficult to hire a new chief coroner, the third in three years.

Solicitor General Rich Coleman refused comment Wednesday and Thursday.

NDP critic Mike Farnworth said he supports an independent review of the coroners service.
