

Law Student Internships – Summer 2017

Based in Vancouver, the B.C. Civil Liberties Association is one of Canada's oldest and most active civil liberties organizations. For over 50 years, the BCCLA has been working to protect and promote civil liberties and human rights in British Columbia and across the country. The BCCLA engages in public interest advocacy through litigation, policy reform, public education and outreach, and casework. Over the summer, we offer a formal student internship program to introduce law students to the BCCLA's public interest advocacy work. Student work in all of our program areas and assist us in litigation, public education, research and outreach. **In summer 2017, we will be hosting students to work full-time for a minimum 12-week period.** Students will work directly with our staff and be based on-site at our office. Law students who have completed at least one year of law school are invited to apply.

The BCCLA is unable to guarantee funding for summer student internships. We encourage students to seek funding from other sources, including fellowship and bursaries, or to obtain course credit for their placement at the BCCLA. **Please note that internships will not be confirmed until funding or course credit has been secured.**

How to Apply

Complete applications include a cover letter, resume, current law school transcripts, a legal writing sample and contact information for two references. Students in the 1L year should also submit a copy of their undergraduate transcripts.

Please email the complete application to caily@bccla.org using "Legal Internship Summer 2017" as the subject line. **The deadline for applications is November 25, 2016.** However, we will accept and evaluate applications on a rolling basis. Students with a strong interest in the BCCLA are encouraged to apply early.
