Members interested in running for election must file notice of their intent with BCCLA’s Election Committee by submitting this Candidate Declaration Form. The completed Candidate Declaration Form may be sent by email to amelie@bccla.org or mailed to the attention of Amélie Malissard at the BCCLA office (306--268 Keefer Street, Vancouver, BC, V6A 1X5). **All applications must be received no later than 5:00 pm PST on April 24, 2026.**

In order for this submission to be valid, the candidate must sign and date this form, initial all declarations, and provide a candidate position statement (see below). This document may be completed in handwritten or electronic form.

The information collected in the penultimate section of the candidate declaration and in questions (a) and (b) below shall be treated as confidential by BCCLA and will be used solely to determine whether you are a qualified candidate under the BCCLA Board of Directors Election Rules, and whether you will be recommended to the membership as a candidate by the Board Recruitment and Elections Committee.

BCCLA Board elections will take place online prior to the BCCLA’s AGM. The voting period will be from Friday, May 22, 2026, through Wednesday, June 5, 2026. Voting will end at 11:59 pm PST. This year, there are 7 seats available on BCCLA’s Board of Directors with 6 incumbent seeking re-election. If there are no contested seats, all eligible candidates will be elected by acclamation.
